- Bulletins – Bulletins are the newsletters that go to members and selected members of the public. Each Bulletin usually contains a message from the President and information about previous and upcoming events. During the course of the year bulletins contain information about the finance drive, contributors, membership recruitment, new members, Candidate events for fall and school board elections, Voter registration, LWVNY or LWVUS Conventions (alternate years), public membership meetings, studies and advocacy, and required notices for the Annual Meeting (nominating report, proposed budget, proposed Program).
